← Trooper Byron Tiller attended the second recruit school in 1940. He was assigned to Sumter County. In 1942, Trooper Tiller took a leave of absence to serve in the United States Armed Services, World War II. He served honorably in the U. S. Navy and was killed on April 7, 1945, during an aircraft attack on a Navy carrier in the South Pacific. He was the uncle to Trooper William B. Tiller, Troop A - Crestview.




