

TOP PERFORMING MEDIUM COUNTY CLERK OF COURTS

County Clerks are evaluated monthly for timeliness and accuracy of data transmitted through TCATS to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The following represent the top performing counties in regards to TCATS errors (accuracy and timeliness) and disposition processing (timeliness).

TCATS ERRORS: The counties below are those with the fewest Central Site and DHSMV existing uncorrected errors in the TCATS system and the lowest monthly error rate. Total errors for the county are determined from the TCATS Report and CCIS query done monthly by DHSMV.

DISPOSITION PROCESSING TO DHSMV: The following represents the counties with the highest percentage of total convictions disposed of within 30 days of the offense date, and highest percentage of conviction dispositions sent to DHSMV within 10 days of the disposition date. Disposition data are provided monthly to DHSMV from the FACC TCATS database.

The State of Florida requires the County Clerk of Court report conviction data to the Department within 10 days of the conviction's disposition. Per federal requirements the Department is then responsible for reporting DUIs and other Serious Traffic Violations to the Problem Driver Pointer System within 31 days. The percent of monthly TCATS errors can be representative of the data which has not been submitted in a timely or accurate fashion, therefore affecting performance of both the County and the State. Out of the 67 counties in Florida, 8 counties had a higher than 2% error rates; of the medium sized counties 9.52% had a higher than 2% error rate. The median and average error rate of all the counties is 0.47% and 0.88% respectively.
