I would like to take this time to praise a Trooper within your district. I have been a Law Enforcement officer in this area for 22 ½ years and I know praise in our profession doesn't come along very often. This is why I am writing this letter to encourage Trooper C. Fowler ID. # 1496 to continue the good work!

On July 26, 2004 my daughter along with my 2 grandchildren were passengers in a vehicle that was involved in a minor accident at Forest Hill Boulevard and I-95. A patrol officer from Lake Clarke Shores responded to the scene and subsequently moved both vehicles to a nearby parking lot. There was little damage to either vehicle during the rear end accident, but my daughter began experiencing neck pain due to the fact she was setting in the middle of the back seat that did not have a head restraint. The Lake Clarke motorman called fire rescue to the scene to look at my daughter and my 3-week-old granddaughter because of her persistent crying. My daughter subsequently summoned me to the scene because of the officer's refusal to generate a report citing there was not enough damage to constitute one. On my arrival, I found I worked with the officer on numerous occasions and would be able to resolve the matter. After explaining the situation much to my surprise the officer still refused to draw a case number or complete a report.

Luckily Trooper Fowler arrived on the scene before the Lake Clarke officer departed. Trooper Fowler also attempted to explain why a report should be generated which fell upon deaf ears. Trooper Fowler showed compassion toward my daughter and grandchildren while investigating the accident. Trooper Fowler used all of his resources, which enabled my daughter to positively identify the driver of vehicle #1. Because of Trooper Fowlers investigation my daughter and her children were able to seek medical treatment before leaving for Georgia the following day. My daughter was sore the next day and continued to improve over the following week. My daughter wanted me to Thank Trooper Fowler for his assistance and help he offered that day. Again Thank Trooper Fowler for me and encourage him to keep his can do attitude, it serves him well!
