## DRIVER LICENSE OFFICE TO CLOSE THIS MONTH

**MELBOURNE** - The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles wants to advise the public of upcoming changes to the local driver license office. The current state-operated driver license office, located at 3442 N. Harbour City Blvd. in Melbourne, will close Feb. 16. The Department will continue to serve customers in Melbourne at the office located at 601 E. University Blvd.

While many DHSMV employees will remain with the Department, the remainder will begin work for the Brevard County Tax Collector's office, which currently offers driver license services in the Merritt Island office and is looking to expand on the partnership soon to offer driver license services in additional locations. We appreciate the growing partnership we share with The Honorable Lisa Cullen and her staff," said Division of Driver Licenses Director Sandra Lambert. "Her willingness to assist customers with excellent service will ensure motorists are provided the best possible service."

"The expansion of services will begin with our offices in Palm Bay and Indian Harbour Beach next month," added Brevard County Tax Collector Lisa Cullen. "We are pleased to be able to assist the residents of Brevard County by offering these services."

Florida now requires additional documents to obtain a new or renewed driver license or ID card, so visit the website to be sure you have all the documents you need before you make the trip.

When possible, the Department encourages customers to skip the trip and conduct their driver license business online at [www.flhsmv.gov](http://www.flhsmv.gov), where they can access various online services. Customers can renew their driver licenses, identification cards and vehicle tags, as well as change their address all from the comfort of their home or office. There are no surcharges for using the Internet. If a customer has received notification from the Department that he/she will have to come into an office, he/she can make an appointment at [www.flhsmv.gov/oasis](http://www.flhsmv.gov/oasis). The online appointment service is an excellent time saving tool.
