## DRIVER LICENSE OFFICE TO CLOSE THIS MONTH

**CRAWFORDVILLE** - The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles wants to advise the public of upcoming changes to the local driver license office. The current state driver license office, located at 202B Ochlocknee Street in Crawfordville, will close July 28. Residents will still be able to access driver license services locally though, because the Wakulla County Tax Collector's office at 202 Ochlocknee Street will begin to offer the services beginning July 31.

"By adding the driver license services to the tax collector's office and our services, we can provide a convenience to customers so they do not have to drive to the next county," said Wakulla County Tax Cheryl Olah.

The closest state-operated driver license office is located at 2900 Apalachee Parkway in Tallahassee, Fla. DHSMV staff there are pleased to serve all customers.

During the transition on July 29 and 30, the Department will send a Florida Licensing On Wheels mobile unit to provide services to customers. FLOW mobiles are equipped with the technology and ability to bring valuable motorist services directly to customers. They provide a convenient method to renew a driver license, obtain a duplicate driver license, change a name or address on a driver license, get an identification card, register a vehicle and purchase a specialty license plate.

"The Department encourages customers to skip the trip and conduct their driver license business online at [www.flhsmv.gov](http://www.flhsmv.gov), where they can access various online services. Customers can renew their driver licenses, identification cards and vehicle tags, as well as change their address all from the comfort of their home or office. There are no surcharges for using the Internet," said the Division of Driver Licenses Director Sandra Lambert. "If a customer has received notification from the Department that they will have to come into an office, they can make an appointment at [www.flhsmv.gov/oasis](http://www.flhsmv.gov/oasis), which is an excellent time saving tool."
