Building Dedicated in Memory of Trooper Milan D. Hendrix

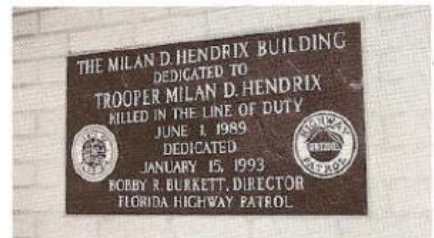
Friends and state dignitaries honored the memory of **Trooper Milan D. Hendrix** with the dedication of the Pensacola Communications Building in January. The late Hendrix was the first FHP trooper killed in the line of duty in the Panhandle.

Colonel Billy Dickson conducted the dedication and presented a plaque to the Hendrix family. Hendrix's brother, **Marque**, currently serves with the FHP in Pensacola and his father **Ray** served as an auxiliary trooper for several years.
