SUBJECT: Subtropical Storm Nicole Emergency Order 110722 Pursuant to Executive Order 22-253 until December 7, 2022

### **Overview:**

On November 07, 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 22-253; providing the Executive Director of the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV) authorization to continue waiving fees for certain transactions, pursuant to Emergency Order 110722, in all counties throughout the state.

#### **Details:**


Pursuant to the Executive Order, the Executive Director of FLHSMV has issued Emergency Order 110722, which takes effect immediately and shall expire at midnight on December 7, 2022, or on the expiration or rescission of this Emergency Order or Executive Order 22-253, whichever is earlier.

This Emergency Order authorizes the following for customers whose licenses, certificates, or documents were lost or stolen as a direct result of adverse weather conditions caused by Subtropical Storm Nicole:


#### **Waived Fees**

Waive fees for duplicate or replacement vessel registration certificates, vessel title
certificates, vehicle license plates, vehicle registration certificates, vehicle tag
certificates, vehicle title certificates, handicapped parking permits, replacement driver
licenses, and replacement identification cards, and to waive the additional fees for the
late renewal of or application for such licenses, certificates, and documents.

 Eligible offices can waive the fees in FRVIS by selecting "Yes" to the following prompt:



- Please be reminded, when processing no fee transactions "EO #22-253" must be shown in the comments/remarks field.
- Eligible offices can waive the replacement fees in **ORION** by selecting "Emergency Event" as the reason type and selecting the No Fee Issuance Reason for 22-253.



 Defer administrative actions and waive fees imposed by law for the late renewal or application for the above licenses, certificates, and documents, which were delayed because of adverse weather conditions, including in counties where FLHSMV has closed offices, or any office of the county Tax Collector that acts on behalf of FLHSMV to process renewals has closed offices due to adverse weather conditions.

All such waivers applied with respect to this emergency before the issuance of this Emergency Order issued under the authority of Executive Orders 22-253 are ratified.
