SUBJECT: CORRECTION – Emergency Order 102822, Extension of Hurricane Ian Emergency Order 092422 pursuant to Executive Orders 22-218 and 22-219 expiring November 22, 2022, extended until December 21, 2022

Overview:

Pursuant to Executive Orders 22-218 and 22-219, Executive Director Terry Rhodes has provided the attached Emergency Order 092422 waiving certain fees and deferral of administrative actions in all counties throughout the state.

The Emergency Order is effective immediately and shall expire at midnight on December 21, 2022, or on the expiration or rescission of this Emergency Order or Executive Orders 22-218 or 22-219, whichever is earlier.

Details:

Below is a list of fees eligible for waiver and deferral of administrative actions due to the Executive and Emergency orders mentioned above:

Waived Fees and Deferred Actions

- Waive fees due to the effects of adverse weather conditions for:
 - o Duplicate or replacement vessel registration, and title certificates
 - Vehicle license plates, validation stickers, vehicle registration and title certificates
 - Handicapped parking permits
 - o Replacement drivers' licenses and identification cards
 - Additional fees for the late renewal of or application for such licenses, certificates, and documents
- Administrative actions are deferred, and fees imposed pursuant to chapters 319, 320, 322 and 328 for the late renewal or application for the above licenses, certificates,

and documents, which were delayed due to the effects of adverse weather conditions, including in counties where the DHSMV has closed offices, or any office of the County Tax Collector that acts on behalf of the DHSMV to process renewals has closed offices due to adverse weather conditions.

When waiving fees, please add "EO 22-218" to the comments/remarks field when completing the transaction. Tax Collectors who contract with License Plate Agents, please ensure that they are aware of the Emergency Order.
