#### **File Naming Convention**

The naming convention of the import file will consist of 15 numerals followed by "fcit" [cn][nnn][yyyymmdd][sq]fcit. Each file that is transmitted needs to have a unique filename. If a file with the same filename has already been processed, an error will be generated, and the file will need to be renamed in order for it to process.

- The first two numerals will be the county number 01 thru67.
- The next three numerals NNN are used to indicate the sending LEA.
  - Fhp will use 000 (ex. 030002016081201fcit for an fhp file for Hillsborough county on August 12<sup>th</sup>2016).
  - Police Departments will use there jurisdiction location from Appendix A with a left padded zero. (ex. 030502016081201fcit for a Tampa Police Department file for Hillsborough county on August 12<sup>th</sup>2016)
  - County Sheriff's offices will use 003 (ex. 030032016081201fcit for a Hillsborough Sherriff's Office file for Hillsborough county on August 12<sup>th</sup> 2016)
- The next eight numerals will be the date in the formatYYYYMMDD.
- The next two numerals will be a sequence number to uniquely identify each file generated for the above date. This will always start with 01 for the first file forthis date and be incremented by one if additional files are created on the same day.

### **Record Format**

Each field in the record should be separated by a pipe (|) with a terminating pipe (|) at the end of the record. (ex. Field1|Field2|Field3|...Field138|)
