WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

• The meeting was called to order at 2:30 p.m. Terrence Samuel began the meeting by welcoming members and visitors and proceeded with the roll call of board members.

REVIEW OF MEETING MINUTES

• Rachel Graham reviewed the meeting minutes from June 14, 2022. No corrections were identified. A motion to approve the minutes was accepted by the board members and the June 14, 2022, meeting minutes were approved.

PHASE II IV&V UPDATE

• Greg Williams presented an overview of the IV&V report for Phase II. The current risk state was green. There were no open deficiencies to report. The schedule performance index was 0.998. 9 of 1,736 total tasks contained in the project schedule were late. The program completion date was forecasted to be 11 days late.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Judy Moats presented a Phase II financial review. The Phase II budget for the 2021 – 2022 fiscal year was \$10.5 million. Approximately \$9.8 million was expended as of June 2022 with a 0% variance and approximately \$616K in remaining funds. The new Phase II budget for the 2022 – 2023 fiscal year is \$9,993,740.





PHASE II PROJECT UPDATE

- Joseph Weldon stated Team A (Title and Registration) was trending behind on testing for Milestone I stories and continued to meet with SEU to discuss regression testing. The team was trending behind on development, testing, and refinement for Milestone J. The team was focusing on original parking permit, parking permit renewal, subsequent parking permit, replacement parking permit, and some change requests. The testers are also focusing on the IFTA/IRP error queue functional area for Milestone I. They have also been working on title modify from a refinement perspective.
- Jennifer Miller stated Team B (MV Globals) is prioritizing work on Milestone J stories related to correspondence on-demand. The team is trending behind on these stories and developers are working on bug fixes to complete generation of these letters. The testers have completed writing test cases as well. They are also working on refinement and development of the history and legacy history functionality groups for Milestones K and L.
- Scott Tomaszewski stated the IFTA/IRP team continued to work on IFTA VOID interface development and mitigate critical bugs reported by Celtic. Mid-way through the Sprint, the team added a technical story related to the error queue. In addition, the team added a missed requirement concerning the IRP calculate license plate credit fee. The team completed Deliverable 19 (Key Performance Measures Criteria Report – Iteration 1). This week SEU is preparing to test the minor IFTA Release 1.3 with approximately three bugs made available by Celtic. The team is working in coordination with Celtic for the IRP code release 2.0 starting on August 18.
 - Key dependencies for the team included:
 - Dependent enterprise core services being stable and available ahead of IFTA/IPR planned development.
 - Key risks and issues for the team included:
 - Risk 111 Cross-team dependency
 - Risk 177 Solution gap identified for manual IFTA distribution process There is a meeting scheduled for July 14 to discuss this further.
 - Issue 66 Hard stop validation bugs impacting Celtic functional testing
 - Important activities for the team included:
 - Finalize IFTA VOID endpoint development
 - Continue bug support resolution with vendor
 - Business/SEU continue testing of intermediate code releases of COTS solution – FLMCS
- Mr. Weldon stated the Florida Smart ID (FSID) team is currently working on change requests related to registration/insurance updates for Tier III review. Design sessions will resume after completion of these.
 - Important activities for the team included:
 - Release 3 November 2022 (tentatively):
 - Online Authentication
 - Design Session held on June 6, 2022
 - Registration/Insurance
 - Design Session held on June 20, 2022
 - Key dependencies for the team included:
 - Keep initial release meaningful but sized for "success" given short timeline.
 - Other vendors are dependent upon Thales Remote Enrollment updates.





- Risks and issues for the team included:
 - Issue 42 Risk 94 Realized FSID Onboarding Trending Late The vendors will begin working on the subcontracts once the Non-Disclosure Agreement is signed.
 - Issue 62 FSID Phase 3 Delayed Start
- Catherine Alvarez presented an overview for the Enterprise Content Management (ECM) Day 1 team and Jennifer Miller presented for the ECM Day 2 team.
 - Day 1 Important activities for the team included:
 - Deployed new ECM content service to production on July 6
 - SEU Verification until July 20
 - Tax Collector Office Pilot July 21 22
 - Statewide Implementation July 23
 - Day 2 Important activities for the team included:
 - Sample document creation/upload in progress
 - Focused on completing Proof of Concept for using Azure Cloud as long-term storage solution
 - Finalizing preparation for starting document conversions next month
 - Key dependencies for the team included:
 - Keep initial release meaningful but sized for "success" given short timeline.
 - Ensure SEU production smoke testing does not exceed the planned 72 hours.
 - Risks and issues for the team included:
 - Risk 101 If NPS cannot quickly configure new documents to be added to the ECM as they are identified and refined by the Phase II Team, then it could impact the schedule as the team waits for implementation of the new document in the ECM.
 - Risk 109 If support for the OnBase COTS system is not identified for internal staff and training received prior to Go-Live, then any OnBase support will need to be leveraged against the current vendor, NPS, and could incur additional cost for FLHSMV.
- Aundrea Powell stated the MyDMV Portal/Fleet team was working in Milestone K, Sprint 36. The team continued to develop and test Milestone K stories including print electronic titles, mark-title-sold, and non-ownership feature. The team plans to refine title transactions including lost-in-transit, duplicate titles, and FSID authentication within MyDMV Portal to align with the Thales dates. They tested, demoed, and received sign-off from the Product Owners on Change Request 19 regarding the MV renewal email notification update. The team is awaiting a go-live date to move this into production.
 - Important activities for the team included:
 - Renewal Notification Change Request changes ready for Production Deployment on July 13
 - Key dependencies for the team included:
 - There are dependencies on the approval and prioritization of new features and any features that can be deployed earlier than the approved release schedule.
 - There are cross-team dependencies on readiness of the code from Team A and MV Globals.





- o Risks and issues for the team included:
 - Issue 15 One developer position currently open.
 - Risk 111 Cross-team dependency Continue to adjust what features to focus on to maintain progress on backlog.

STAKEHOLDER OUTREACH

• Terrence Samuel stated the team held a Tax Collector Focus Group meeting in Orlando, Florida from June 28 – 29, 2022. The team plans to have a meeting with the license plate agencies soon.

COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

- Ann Naiman stated the Phase II User Guides teams have been established and will begin development of the four user guides for T&R, IFTA/IRP, MV Globals, and Portal/Fleet, and update the Motor Vehicles User Manual.
- She stated team members attended the Tax Collector training with Department of Revenue on June 24, 2022.
- She also stated the team will be attending the Florida Law Enforcement Traffic Safety Challenge event in Orlando, Florida from July 13 14, 2022.

Q&A

- Public member Joshua Price asked since FSID is issued by FLHSMV and has both the licensee's photo and signature will it be able to be used as a valid ID for voting in Florida?
- Mr. Samuel confirmed this is a use case we plan to discuss with the Department of State in the future.

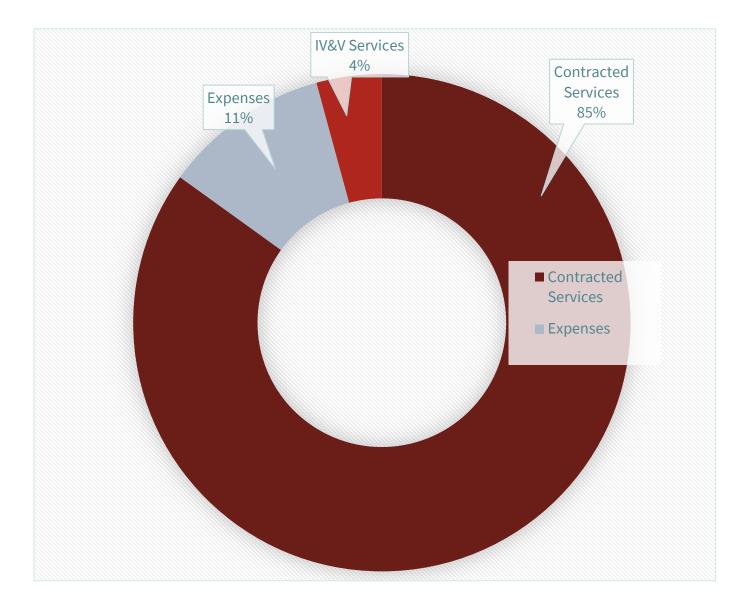

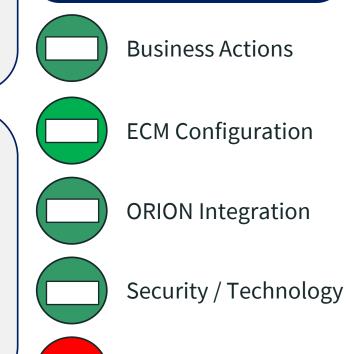

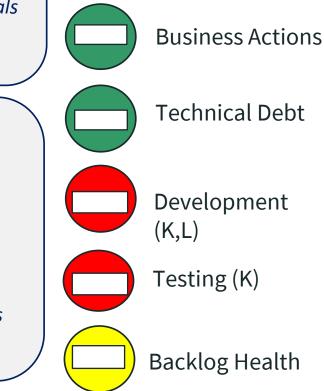
