Legal Authority

Section 320.01 (37)-(40), Florida Statutes, provides the definitions associated with vehicles and wreckers.

<u>Section 320.06(3)(a)</u> and <u>320.0821</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, provide the requirements for the design of the license plates and wrecker license plates.

<u>Section 320.08(5)(d) and (c), Florida Statutes</u>, provides the registration taxing structure for the tow types of wrecker licenses plates.

Description and Use

This procedure provides information and instructions to assist employees of the tax collector, license plate agent, and the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV) with issuing registrations to wreckers.

Definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to the issuance and use of wrecker license plates:

A. "Wrecker" means any motor vehicle that is used to tow, carry or otherwise transport motor vehicles

and is equipped for that purpose with a boom, winch, car carrier or other similar equipment.

B. "Tow" means to pull or draw any motor vehicle with a power unit by means of a direct attachment,

drawback or other connection or to carry a motor vehicle on a power unit designed to transport such

vehicle from one location to another.

C. "Disabled motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle which is not operable under its own motive

power, excluding a non-disabled trailer or semitrailer, or any motor vehicle that is unsafe for

operation upon the highways of this state.

D. "Replacement motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle under tow by a wrecker to the location of a

disabled motor vehicle to replace the disabled motor vehicle and enable the transfer of its operator,

passengers and load to an operable motor vehicle.

Eligibility Criteria

There are two types of registration classifications for wreckers. Although an affidavit is not required, owners

must declare how they plan to use their wrecker(s)(tow truck). The appropriate license plate will be issued

based on the eligibility criteria provided below:

A. A Regular Wrecker is a wrecker or tow truck which is used to tow any of the following: a vessel, a

disabled vehicle, an abandoned vehicle, a stolen and recovered vehicle, an impound vehicle or a

replacement motor vehicle. Refer to the definitions in this procedure under Definitions section, C

and D.

1. When applying for a Regular Wrecker license plate, the net weight and GVW are required to be

entered in the motor vehicle issuance system. If the GVW is 55,000 pounds or more, the wrecker is

subject to payment of, or exemption from, the federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax (HVUT). You must

always submit IRS Schedule 1, form 2290 even if the wrecker is exempt from payment of HVUT.

See RS-34 for additional information.

B. A GVW Wrecker is a wrecker or tow truck, which shall be used and registered according to what it is

towing or hauling. When applying for a GVW Wrecker license plate, the net weight and GVW are

required to be entered in the motor vehicle issuance system.

1. If a GVW Wrecker is used to tow a nondisabled motor vehicle, a vessel or any other cargo, the

owner must declare the GVW of such wrecker to include the net weight of the motor vehicle and

the maximum weight of the load it carries.

2. If a GVW Wrecker is used to tow a disabled, abandoned, stolen-recovered, impound motor vehicle

or replacement vehicle, it may do so without having the weight restrictions imposed. Weight

restrictions do apply, however, if the GVW Wrecker is hauling cargo.

Application Requirements

A. Declaration

The customer must declare how the wrecker or tow truck will be used when requesting a regular

wrecker or GVW wrecker license plate from any local county license plate agency.

B. Proof of Insurance

The customer must submit proof of commercial motor vehicle insurance. Refer to RS-33 for

additional information.

C. Heavy Vehicle Use Tax

When the combined GVW of the wrecker and any towed vehicle or vehicles is 55,000 pounds or more,

the customer must provide proof of filing for, or payment of federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax.

D. Fees and Class Codes:

The fees required are based on the declared use of the wrecker as follows:

1. Regular Wrecker: Original License Plate fee, Decal on Demand fee, Service Fee, Branch fee if

applying through a county branch agency, registration tax from the Tax Due and Credit Manual

for class code 92 and trust fund fees from the Class Code/Fee Chart. Refer to the Registration Fees

and Flat Taxes Distribution Chart for applicable fees.

2. GVW Wrecker: Original License Plate Fee, Decal on Demand fee, Service fee, Branch fee if applying

through a county branch agency, registration tax from the Tax Due and Credit Manual for class

code 41 using the owners declared gross vehicle weight, and trust fund fees from the Class

Code/Fee Chart. Refer to the Registration Fees and Flat Taxes Distribution Chart for applicable

fees.

Issuance of License Plates

The Regular Wrecker or GVW Wrecker license plate(s) may be issued at any county license plate agency.

A single Regular Wrecker license plate is to be displayed on the back of the vehicle.

A single GVW Wrecker license plate for wreckers having a GVW of 26,000 pounds and under must be

displayed on the rear of the vehicle with the validation decal.

Dual GVW Wrecker license plates are issued for wreckers having a GVW of 26,001 pounds or more and must

be displayed on the front and rear of the vehicle. The validation decal must be affixed to the front license

plate.

Because the number of GVW wrecker license plates we issue is relatively low, we do not and will not have an

inventory code to distinguish between a GVW wrecker 26,001 pounds or more and a GVW wrecker 26,000

pounds and under. You will continue to use the existing inventory code regardless of the GVW weight.

If you previously issued dual license plates to a wrecker with a GVW of 26,000 pounds and under, one plate

with the validation decal must be displayed on the rear of the vehicle. The second plate may be displayed

on the front of the vehicle, although it is not required.

The department will not recall any dual GWV license plates that were issued to wreckers with a GVW of

26,000 pounds and under. Instead, these license plates can be renewed each year until it is time for them to

be replaced.

PRIDE will continue to issue dual plates regardless of the GVW; however, you will issue single or duplicate

license plates based on the weight. After issuing a single GVW plate to a GVW wrecker 26,000 pounds and

under, you should hold the remaining duplicate plate for pick up by PRIDE.

Renewals and Transfers

Renewals and transfers of these license plates may be processed at any county license plate agency. License

plates issued for wreckers and tow trucks with the word "WRECKER" embossed at the bottom of the license

plate may only be transferred to another vehicle used as a wrecker. For additional information on transfers,

refer to RS-05.

Replacement License Plates

Replacement license plates may be issued by any county license plate agency. The following are required:

- A. A copy of the vehicle registration certificate.
- B. Form <u>Application for Replacement License Plate</u>, <u>Validation Decal or Parking Permit HSMV 83146</u>. Form and applications must be complete and accurate.
- C. Payment of the applicable fees, which include the following: Replacement fee, Decal on Demand fee, Service fee, Branch fee if applying through a county branch agency, Air Pollution Control fee, Reflectorization fee, Emergency Medical Services fee, Advanced Replacement fee and FRVIS fee.
 Refer to the Registration Fees and Flat Taxes Distribution Chart for applicable fees.
- D. When a customer reports a license plate or decal as stolen to a law enforcement agency and attest to this on form HSVM 83146, the tax collector or license plate agency should not charge a fee for the replacement license plate or decal. See RS-06.
